The increase in practitioners contributes, among other things, to feed the budget of the clubs and to expand the number of young and very young people who start and get excited about fencing.

In this sense, the project on "Laser Fencing" put in place by the French Fencing Federation is extremely interesting. We know that Laser Fencing, in recent years, has led thousands of practitioners to approach fencing.

It being perceived as more "playful" and unconventional than other Olympic disciplines, attracts many young people into fencing with positive effects on the number of licences, and we should also consider that for children it can be an effective teaching tool to gradually start them on a path to Olympic fencing.

Given the above, and having positively evaluated the initiative, the Comex of the European Fencing Confederation has decided to organize a course for Laser Fencing coaches.

The initiative is included in the "Solidarity Programme" project and the French Federation is available to provide two qualified coaches of "Laser Fencing" to create a course for coaches of this innovative and captivating discipline.

The course will last 16 hours (from 2 pm on Friday to 12 pm on Sunday), and is available to a maximum of 3 candidates per federation. It will take place in Budapest, on the occasion of the 2023 European Under 23 Championships.
